## **Committee Reports**

## **Academic Report:**

**Mystica Nelmes, Principal** 

Mystica Nelmes gave an overview of academic status including the following points and newly implemented programs:

- ESL testing 25 students
- World Peace assembly
- Student council raised \$180 for buddy walk
- Big Sweep-had the most clean in all of CC
- BLT finished the SIP
- · Hired new music teacher
- Looking for ELA
- DTAP for 6<sup>th</sup> grade due
- Mint Hill fundraiser raised \$1020 for new school
- Gravel lot raised \$550
- Made the BOD for Charter association
- BASP now has 62 members
- Wrote a federal grant for a new EC Assistant
- International Festival is tomorrow

Kim Hoyle had the following updates:

- Military forms were included in the beginning of the year packets and we have 40 families that qualify.
- Economically disadvantaged forms were also in the beginning of the year packets and we have 26% families that qualify.
- The Cabarrus County Chamber of Commerce held a focus group on how to incorporate businesses into curriculum.
- The Finance Class is partnered with 5/3 Bank and the Dave Ramsey Program.
- Woodson University wants to come visit our school.
- Will be attending the testing meeting tomorrow.
- MAP scheduling is underway
- Curriculum nights were successful.
- International Festival will be held October 12, 2012.

Scott Elliott asked for an update on where we were with the new common core standards. We started implementing common core last year and it is completely integrated this school year.

**School Improvement Plan Beth Torres** 

Beth Torres presented the School Improvement Plan for review pointing out the following improvement foci for the 2012 – 2013 school year:

# Globally Competitive Students:

- By June 2013, Carolina International School will increase the percentage of students in grades 3 8 that are proficient in math by 2.6% from 91.5% to 94.1% as measured by READY NC EOG scores.
- By June 2013, Carolina International School will increase the percentage of students in grades 3 8 that are proficient in reading by 2.2% from 88.1% to 90.3% as measured by READY NC EOG scores.
- By June 2013, Carolina International School will increase the percentage of students in grades 5 and 8 that are proficient in Science in by 2.7% from 79.4% to 82.2% as measured by READY NC EOG scores.
- By June 2013, Carolina International School will implement mClass Reading 3D for all students in grades K 2.

#### 21st Century Professionals:

By June, 2013, Carolina International School will employ, support, and train 100% of its staff to be 21st Century Professionals while maintaining at least 100% of its staff as highly qualified in his or her certified area as recognized by the state of North Carolina.

#### Healthy and Responsible Students:

- By June 2013, 100% of teachers will read the Leader in Me in preparation for the developing Character Education Program.
- By June 2013, Carolina International School teachers' level of influence on decision making in the school will increase by 10% from 64.7% to 74.7% as measured by the Teacher Working Conditions Survey.
- By April 2013, the BOD will gather data to measure increased accessibility based on the parent survey, with a 10% increase from 72.9%

## Leadership:

By June 2013, the BOD will gather data from the 2012-2013 parent survey to measure administrations level of professionalism and responsiveness from 70% to 80% satisfaction.

#### 21st Century Systems:

By June 2013, All Carolina International School Teachers will be provided a laptop as a part of a 1:1 computing initiative for use in their classrooms to improve student achievement and model 21st Century skills as measured by parent/teacher survey.

**Finance Report:** Sam Leder & Abby Bottoms

Reviewed the budget as of 9-30-12 and discussed the recommended changes. Curtis Ifill motioned to approve the budget with the changes. Terry Clay Meadows seconded. Motion passed.

#### New building update:

- Reviewing several funding options with Wells Fargo, Charter School Capital and RBC.
- Plans are ready to go to permitting as soon as funding is finalized.
- We are a few months behind, and an August 2013 open date is not possible.
- We are moving forward while being mindful of the budget impacts the new school will have in future years.
