#### **Curtis Ifill**

- Looking into the E-Rate program for IT infrastructure upgrades.
- Solar panel construction to begin by the end of the month.
- Looking at ways to reduce noise pollution in the gym.

#### **Head of School Report**

- 899 students currently enrolled (peak enrollment was 908). We are no longer enrolling new students and 7 seniors graduated early.
- Current lottery applications down about 300 from previous year.
  - Expect about 750 applications by lottery cut-off.
    - There are fewer seats available for the upcoming school year but applications tend to come in after lottery.
- Staff Updates
  - Vani (Admissions Coordinator) leaving in March. She has provided solid work for enrollments. Her replacement, Rebecca Aranyi, has started and will work alongside Vani for thorough training.
  - Lakisha is leaving by end of February, currently searching for her replacement.
  - Eddie has been doing great work on the grounds!
- Athletics Updates
  - Great feedback on the CIS vs. Bradford Prep basketball game!
  - Have new corporate partner as a result of the game.
- 2017-2018 school year lottery
  - Lottery will be held March 4 at 9am; cutoff for application submission is Feb 23.
  - Using new vendor this year, Info Snap (owned by Power School). Software will help save man hours for registration and offers live support during lottery.

#### **Principal's Report**

- High school diplomas have arrived and names have been verified.
- Currently completed 6 of 10 information sessions.
- Partnering with Michelle Boyd through CMC Main to promote medical/healthcare careers to juniors and seniors. CIS is the first school in the region to participate (and program is free of charge). Highlights of program include: 6 anatomy modules, service hour opportunities, and direct access to medical leaders.
- There have been many great field trips.
- Colin McNulty swam in the state championship meet as a varsity swimmer and placed 24<sup>th</sup> overall.
- Seniors have total of \$188,000 in scholarships to date.
- Held cookie reception for students with honor roll and/or perfect attendance.
- Implementing new program for positive referrals for good behavior. Students rewarded with ice cream party from PTSO.

#### **Teacher Report**

- First grade had field trip to Charlotte Children's Museum and Dorton Park.
- Fourth grade science class completed their rocks and minerals lesson.
- Sixth grade student, Rajbalan Yogarajan, took 1st place in the Cabarrus County Soil & Water Conservation Contest. Raj will advance to the area competition; if he wins he will advance to the state level with a chance to win \$200.
- Seventh grade, Mr Eitner class, will focus next on WWII in social studies. For creative writing, students have been working on advertisements.
- Many fun art projects for students including sign language, self-portraits, and learning about how monks create mandalas.
- Seniors have a lip sync fundraiser on Feb 17<sup>th</sup> at 7pm in the atrium.
- Seniors also working on electron configurations and compound equations.
